

*samutkrīḍā* (EI 15), same as *krīḍā* or sport.

*samva* (IE 8-1), mistake for *sāmva* which is an abbreviation of *sāmvatsara*.

*sāmva* (IE 8-1) same as *sāmvat*; contraction of *sāmvatsara*.

*sāmvadana* (IE 8-8), submission of information.

*sāmvarta-kalpa* (CII 1), the aeon of destruction.

*sāmvāsa*, cf. *a-kūra-cullaka-vināsi-khaṭvā-sāmvāsa* (IE 8-5); same as *āvāsa*; shelter or accommodation [which the villagers were obliged to supply to the touring officers of the king].

*sāmvat* (IE 8-1), originally an abbreviation of *sāmvatsara* (a year) or any of its declensional cases that can be used in expressing a date; later stereotyped in the sense of 'a year' or 'an era'. It was generally regarded as indeclinable; but we have some cases of the use of forms with case-endings, e. g., *sāmvatāḥ*, *sāmvatā*, *sāmvatī* and *sāmvatām*. See also *sāmivate* (IE 8-1), the seventh case-ending of *sāmvatā*, a corrupt form of *sāmvat*. Since the late medieval age, the word specially indicates the Vikrama era, although originally it was used with the name of any reckoning in quoting the dates of records, especially the regnal reckoning. The word is used in inscriptions in a large number of corrupt forms, e.g., *sāmvatā*, *sāmvatā*, *sāmata*, *sāmanta*, *sāmatta*, *sāmmat*, *sāmasta*, *smat*, *sāmvalu*, *sāmvalu*, etc., etc.

*sāmvat* (IE 8-1), mistake for *sāmvat*, originally an abbreviation of *sāmvatsara*.

*sāmvatsara* (CII 3; 4; IA 17), 'a year'; 'an era', the earlier years of the Indian eras being quoted by this term (or by its abbreviations *sām*, *sāmvat*, etc.), without any dynastic or other appellation just as in the case of the year of a regnal reckoning.

*Sāmvatsara* (HD), an astrologer. See *Viṣṇu Dh. S.*, III. 75; *Bṛhatasamhitā*, 2. 9; cf. *Sāmvatsarika* (EI 5).

*sāmvatsara-pratipadā*, name of a *tithi*.

*sāmvatsara-śrāddha* (CII 4), *śrāddha* performed on the first anniversary of a person's death.

*sāmvatsara-vāriya* (SITI), annual committee appointed by the *sabhā*; annual committee for supervising the management of village affairs; also called *āṭṭi-vāriyam* (SITI) in Tamil.

*sāmvatsara-vimokṣa-śrāddha* (CII 4), same as *sāmvatsara-śrāddha* performed on the first anniversary of a person's death.

*Sāmvatsarika* (HD), an astrologer. See *Paiṅhīnasi* quoted
