gadhiyā—hamsapada

gadhiyā-paisā, same as gadhiyā (q.v.). gadiyāņa, same as gadyāņa. gadyā, abbreviation of gadyāņa. gadyāna, same as gadyāņa.

gadyāņa, a gold coin or weight; generally regarded as 48 ratis (about 88 grains) in weight; sometimes called 'the gold gadyāṇa'; sometimes regarded as a coin like a farthing, equal to $\frac{1}{4}$ or $\frac{1}{5}$ of the paikamu (q.v.); regarded in some places as equal to 20 vals, 8 māşas or $\frac{1}{2}$ tola.

gadyānaka, same as gadyānaka or gadyāna (q.v.). gadyānaka, same as gadyāna.

gadyāņa-ponnu, 'gadyāņa of gold'; same as pon-gadyāņa; see gadyāņa.

gandā, equal to 4 cowrie-shells; $\frac{1}{20}$ of a pana; cf. gandaka.

gaņdagopālaņ-mādai, 'māda issued or minted by Gaņdagopāla'; see mādai.

gaņdaka, same as gaņdā. Cf. kākinī.

ganda-mada, probably 'mada bearing the figure of a rhinoceros' or an abbreviation of Gandagopalan-madai (q.v.); sometimes characterised by the epithet 'small'; sometimes also called karsapana, niska and ganda-niska; see mada.

gaņda-niska, same as gaņda; see māda and niska.

gandhashasti-māda, same as gandhavāraņa-māda; probably, 'māda bearing the figure of an elephant in rut'; see māda.

gānī, cf. aļha-gānī, equal to a ļanka and weighing a tola. gara-dramma, see dramma.

gāva-gadyāņa, see gadyāņa.

 $gha i i ta -h i na - dramm \bar{a} h$, 'drammas (money) that are wanting'; see dramma.

golakā, same as gulikā, etc.

golakkai, Tamil; same as golakā (gulikā).

grāsagraha, same as suvarņa (q.v.).

gulikā, same as golakā, etc.; a small coin apparently globular or circular in shape; supposed to be a coin issued by the Sambhuvarāya chiefs and also by the Pāṇḍyas; cf. vīrachampan-kuligai and vallāl-vali-tirantān-gulikai.

guñjā, same as rati or raktikā (1.83 or about $1\frac{3}{4}$ grains).

 $h\bar{a}ga$, Kannada; same as Sanskrit $bh\bar{a}ga$; probably $\frac{1}{4}$ of the standard coin; see $p\bar{a}ga$.

hamsapada, same as suvarna (q.v.).
