Citrāngada², a prince. § 232 (Svayamvarap.): I, 186, 7002 (-*Çubhāngadau*, present at the svayamvara of Draupadi). Citrāngada³, a Kuru warrior. § 604 (Karnap.): VIII, 7, †209 (in the enumeration of the Kuru warriors who were still alive).

Citrāngada⁴, a Kalinga king. § 621 (Rājadh.): XII, 4, 109 (*tatah kadācid rājanāh samājagmuh svayamvare | Kalingavishaye rājan rājñāg Citrāngadasya ca grīmad Rājapuram nāma nagaram*).

Citrāngada⁵, a Daçārṇa king. § 785 (Anugītāp.): XIV, 83, 2471 (when the sacrificial horse, followed by Arjuna, came to the country of the Daçārnas, their king C. was vanquished by Arjuna).

Citrāngadā¹, daughter of Citravāhana and mother of Babhruvāhana. § 11 (Parvasaṅg.): I, 2, 608 (*°āyāh putrena putrikāyāh*, i.e. Babhruvāhana).—§ 249 (Arjunavanavāsap.): I, 215, 7826 (the only child of king Citravāhana in Maṇipūra, whom he made a putrikā, married to Arjuna).—§ 250 (do.): I, 217, 7883 (C.'s and Arjuna's son Babhruvāhana is installed upon the throne in Maṇipūra).—§ 785 (Anugītāp.): XIV, 79, 2339; 80, (2352); 81, 2405 (*Caitravāhanī*), 2425 (*Kauravyāduhitūḥ*); 88, 2604: In the encounter between Arjuna and Babhruvāhana both fell down in a swoon. Babhruvāhana regained consciousness and C. prevailed upon Ulūpi to revive Arjuna.—§ 787 (Ācramavāsap.): XV, 1a, 23 (waited upon Gāndhāri); 15v, †437 (accompanies Dhṛtarāshṭra and Gāndhāri to the forest).—§ 788 (do.): XV, 25v, †666.—§ 794 (Mahāprasthānikap.): XVII, 1, 28 (sets out for Maṇipūra). Citrāngadā², an Apsaras. § 731b (Ashtāvakra-Diksāmv.): XIII, 19β, 1424 (enumeration).

Citrāngadāsuta, “son of Citrāngadā” = Babhruvāhana: XIV, 2326.

Citrāngadātmaja, do. = Babhruvāhana: XIV, 2337, 2431.

Citrāngadopākhyāna(m), “episode relating to Citrāngada.” § 166 (cf. Satyavatīlābhop.): I, 101. Two sons were born of Satyavatī, Citrāngada and Vicitraviryā. Before the last had attained to majority, Īśanu died and ascended to heaven. Bhīṣma placed Citrāngada on the throne. Citrāngada considered nobody his equal, not even the gods and Asuras. Therefore the king of the Gandharvas bearing the same name fought a three years' battle with him at Kurukshetra on the banks of the Sarusvati, where Citrāngada was slain; then the Gandharva ascended to heaven. Bhīṣma installed Vicitraviryā, yet in his minority, on the throne of the Kurus and ruled for him. (For continuation v. Vicitraviryop.)

Citraratha⁵, the great-grandfather of Kṛṣṇa. § 768b (Kṛṣṇa Vāsudeva): XII, 147, 6839 (son of Rāshgu and father of Cūra).
