Daksha¹ (Prācetas), a Prajāpati. § 3 (Anukram.): I,
1, 33 (Prācetasas tathā D^o D^oputrāç ca saptā vai, came out
of the primordial egg). — § 87 (Amçāvāt.): I, 65, 2519
(thirteen daughters of D., viz. Aditi, etc., married to
Kaçyapa). — § 115 (Amçāvāt.): I, 66, 2574 (D. sprung
from the right toe of Brahmā, and his wife from the left
toe of Brahmā. D. had lost his sons (*nashṭaputraḥ*),
(cf. § 138), but had 50 daughters, whom he made his
putrikāḥ; 10 of them were married to Dharma, 27 to Indu,
i.e. the Moon, 13 to Kaçyapa). — § 136 (Yayātyup.): I,
75, 3126 (Prajāpatih). — § 137 (Sambhavap.): Prācetas
had 10 sons (*mukhañenāgninā yāis te pūrvām dagdha
maharjasaḥ*, PCR. seems to have followed a different reading),
from them sprang the muni Daksha Prācetas, and from
him the creatures (*sa hi Lokāpitāmahāḥ*): I, 75, 3130
(Prācetasah). — § 138 (do.): Daksha had from his wife
Viññi 1,000 sons, whom Nārada taught the Sāṅkhyas as
a means of salvation (*moksham adhyāpayañ dā Sāṅkhyas
jnānam anuttamam*). Then Daksha made his 50 daughters

his *putrikāḥ*, and bestowed 10 of them to Dharma, etc.
(cf. § 115); I, 75, 3131 (Prācetasah), 3132 (*°putrāñ*). —
