Tālacara, pl. (*āh*), a people. § 569 (Bhagavadyānap.): V, 140_β, 4451. Cf. Tālajaṅgha pl.

Tāladhvaja ("whose banner shows the palmyra palm") = Bhīshma, q.v.—Do.² (do.) = Balarāma: IX, 1948 (*Rāmah*), 2189, 3044.

Tālajaṅgha ("the king of the Tālajaṅghas?"). § 547 (Karna): III, 303, 17014 (had been destroyed by the curse of a brahman (*brahmadanḍena*)).—§ 736b (Vītahavyop.): XIII, 30, 1946 (Haihaya and T. were the sons of Vatsa).—§ 772g (Aurva): XIII, 154, 7223 (*°ṇ mahākshatram Aurvoaikena nāçilam*).

Tālajaṅgha, pl. (*°āh*), a people. § 387 (Sagara): III, 106, 8832 (the Haihayas and the T. were vanquished by Sagarā).—§ 562 (Bhagavadyānap.): V, 74_γ, 2729 (*Bahulas T°andm*).—§ 739 (Ānuçāsanik.): XIII, 34_γ, 2126 (vanquished by the Bhṛgu, cf. XIII, 7223).

Tālavana, pl. (*°āh*), a people. § 284 (Sahadeva): II, 31, 1175 (in the south, vanquished by Sahadeva).

Tālin = Çiva (1000 names°).

Tamas¹, a brahman. § 736b (Vītahavyop.): XIII, 30, 2002 (son of Çravas and father of Prakāça).

Tamas² = Çiva (1000 names°).

Tamasā, a river. § 494 (Āṅgīrasa): III, 222, 14231 (among the rivers who are mothers of fires).—§ 574 (Jambūkh.): VI, 9_λ, 338.

Tamasī, a river. § 574 (Jambūkh.): VI, 9_λ, 339 (only C., B. has *Mānavī*).

***Tamoghna** ("destroying darkness") = Sūrya (the Sun): III, 193; VII, 6296.

Tamontakrt, a warrior of Skanda. § 615u (Skanda): IX, 45_η, 2560.

***Tamonuda** ("dispersing darkness") = Sūrya (the Sun): III, 152, 11892, 17099; VI, 5765.

Tāmra¹, wife of Kaçyapa (?). § 126 (Amçāvat.): I, 166, 2620 (mother of five daughters: Kākī, Çyenī, Bhāsī, Dhṛtarāshṭrī, and Çukī).

Tāmra², a river. § 459 (Mārkaṇḍeyas.): III, 188_a, 12909 (seen in the body of Nārāyaṇa).—§ 574 (Jambūkh.): VI, 9_λ, 335.

Tāmracūḍa, a companion of Skanda. § 610u (Skanda): IX, 46, 2669 (given to Skanda by Aruṇa; "a cock" PCR.).

Tāmracūḍā, a mātṛ. § 615u (Skanda): IX, 46_θ, 2636.

Tāmrahvaya, name of a dvīpa. § 284 (Sahadeva): II, 31, 1172 (*dvīpam*, in the south, conquered by Sahadeva).

Tāmralipta ("the king of the Tāmraliptas"). § 232 (Svayamvarap.): I, 186, 6993 (present at the svayamvara of Draupadī).—§ 280 (Bhīmasena): II, 30, 1098 (*rajānam*, in the east, conquered by Bhīmasena).

Tāmralipta, pl. (*°āh*), a people. § 295 (Dyūtap.): II, 52, 1874 (brought tribute to Yudhishṭhira). Cf. next.

Tāmraliptaka, pl. (*°āh*), a people (= the prec.). § 574 (Jambūkh.): VI, 9_μ, 364.—§ 595 (Shoḍacarāj., v.
