

Vāsavyea—Vasishtha.

Vāsavyea ("the son of Vāsavi [i.e. Satyavatī]"') = Vyāsa: I, 59.

Vāsavi ("the son of Vāsava [i.e. Indra]"') = Arjuna, q.v. (add. VII, 745, 1209, 2786, 3301, 3731; VIII, 2597).

Vāsavi ("the daughter of Vasu [Uparicara]"') = Satyavatī: I, 2401.

Vashaṭkāra¹ (the exclamation *vashaṭ* or *vaushaṭ* uttered at oblations, e.g.: I, 923; VIII, 1489, 1499; X, 792; XII, 11290, cf. *nirvashaṭkāra*: XIII, 6365, 6745) = Mahāpurusha (Mahāpurushastava).—Do.² = Vishṇu (1000 names).

Vasishtha (*Vaṭi*^o C.), a ḥshi, son of Varuṇa (or of Mitra and Varuṇa), one of the Saptarshis, husband of Arundhatī (Akṣhamālā), father of Čakt(r)i and grandfather of Parāçara. [Sometimes *V.* is reckoned among the Prajāpatis (spiritual sons of Brahmā)]. § 61 (Sarpasattra): I, 55, 12110 (^o*vat*).—§ 130 (Aṁçāvāt.): I, 67, 2710 (^o*sya* *çāpēna*, all. to § 164).—§ 134 (Viçvāmitra): I, 71, 2923 (^o*m* *yah* *putrair* *ishṭair* *vyayojayat*, cf. § 224).—§ 153 (Pūrvavāc.): I, 94, 3732 (*rshih*), 3735 (became the purohita of Saṃvaraṇa, whom he installed).—§ 161 (Mahābhishop.): I, 96, 3853 (*çaptūḥ* . . . ^o*V**ena*, sc. the Vasus, cf. § 164), 3854.—§ 163 (Bhīshmotpatti): I, 98, 3914 (^o*çāpadōsheṇa*, all. to § 164).—§ 164 (Āpavop.): I, 99, 3924 (^o*nāmā sa munīḥ* . . . *Āpavah*) (the Vasu *Dyaus* stole the *homadhenu* of *V.*; *V.* then cursed the Vasus to be reborn (Dyaus as Bhīshma)).—§ 165 (Satyavatīlābhop.): I, 100, 4001 (Bhīshma learnt the Vedas with their Aṅgas from *V.*).—§ 188 (Maduyantī): I, 122, 4736 (*Madayantī jagāma rshīṇ* ^o*m* . . . *taṣṭal lebhe ca* *śāputram* *Aṁmakān*, cf. § 225).—§ 191 (Arjuna): I, 123, 4807 (among the seven maharshis present at the birth of Arjuna).—§ 222 (Tapatyup.): I, 173, 6596 (*rshisattamāṇi*), 6601, 6604 (*rshih*), (6605), 6609, 6610 (*maharshih*), 6612, 6614 (*rshih*), 6615, 6617, 6619, 6627 (the purohita of Saṃvaraṇa, prevailed upon Sūrya to give Saṃvaraṇa Tapatī in marriage).—§ 223 (Vāsishtha): I, 174, 6635, 6636, 6638 (*Brahmaṇo mānasāḥ putro* ^o*V**o* 'rundhātīpatih), 6639 (only B., etymology), 6643 (*rshisattamāṇi*); 175, 6649 (*Viçvāmitra*-^o*yoh*), 6654 (^o*āgramāṇi*), 6655 (*rshih*), 6657, (6665), (6668), 6670 (^o*sya* *nandī*), (6672), 6673, (6676), (6678), 6679 (the hostility between *V.* and Viçvāmitra).—§ 224 (Kalmāshapāda): I, 176, 6701 (^o*kulavardhanāṇi*, i.e. Čakt(r)i), 6710 (*Viçvāmitra*-^o*yoh*), 6712 (*rshēḥ* *putraṇi* ^o*sya* ^o*m* *iva tejasā*, i.e. Čakt(r)i), 6736 (^o*syaiva* *putreshu*), 6737 (*putrāṇi* ^o*sya*) (when Kalmāshapāda had been cursed by Čakt(r)i and Viçvāmitra had caused a Rākshasa to possess him, Kalmāshapāda devoured Čakt(r)i and the other sons of *V.*).—§ 225 (Vāsishtha): I, 178, 6738; 177, (6758), 6760 (*rshih*), 6763, (6767), 6769 (*rshih*), 6771 (6775), 6779, 6780, 6782 (*maharshīṇā*), 6787, 6788 (*rshih*) (from grief *V.* in vain tried to commit suicide, but, hearing of his daughter-in-law being quick with child, he refrained from his purpose. *V.* afterwards delivered Kalmāshapāda from the curse, and begot Aṁmakā on his queen Madayantī).—§ 226 (Parūcara): I, 178, 6794 (*munīḥ*, grandfather of Parāçara), 6795 (*munīṇi*), 6796 (*vipravarshīṇi*), 6802.—§ 227 (Aurvop.): I, 178, (6802); 179, (6826); 180, (6862) (told Parāçara the story of Aurva).—§ 228 (do.): I, 181, 6865, 6868, 6871, 6882 (*ye ca* *Çaktryavaraḥ* *putrā* ^o*sya* *mahāmuniḥ*), 6883, 6885.—§ 229 (Vasishthop.): I, 182, 6889, 6891, 6907 (*rshih*), 6909, 6912 (on account of a curse denounced upon Kalmāshapāda, *V.* begat a son on his queen, cf. § 225).—§ 240 (Vaivāhikap.): I, 199, 7352 (*yathā* . . . ^o*V**e* *cāpy* Arundhatī, sc. *bhava* *bhar*/*rshu*).—§ 249 (Arjunavānavāśap.): I, 215, 7813 (^o*ma*

ca parvatām, near Himavat (?)).—§ 259b (Arundhatī): I, 233, 8456 (*Saptarshimadhyagāṇi* . . . *muniṇi*, his wife, Arundhatī, became jealous of him).—§ 270 (Brahmasabhāv.): II, 11, 436 (among the *prajānām* *patayāḥ* in the palace of Brahmā).—§ 327 (Draupadi-paritāpav.): III, 31, 1171 (among those ḥshis who have become of pure souls by virtue).—§ 347 (Nulopākhyānap.): III, 64, 2462 (^o*Bhrgv-**Atrisamaiḥ*).—§ 358 (Tirthayātrāp.): III, 82, 4098 (^o*āgramo* ^o*sya*, a tīrtha on the mountain Arbuda).—§ 368 (do.): III, 83, 7050 (^o*syāgramāṇi*, at Badarīpācana).—§ 370 (do.): III, 84, 8118 (^o*āgramo* ^o*sya*, a tīrtha at the Niçcirā).—§ 376 (do.): III, 85, 8264 (among the ḥshis who expect Yudhiṣṭhīra on his tīrthayātrā).—§ 384 (Agastyop.): III, 102, 8739 (^o*syāgramo*).—§ 391 (Rshyaçringa): III, 113, 10092 (Arundhatī vā subhāgā ^o*m* . . . *yathā*, sc. *paryacarat*).—§ 410 (Vipācā): III, 130, 10544 (*atra*—i.e. in the Vipācā—*vai* *putraçokona* ^o*V**o* *bhagavāṇi* *rshih* *baddhrūtmāṇam* *nipatito* *vipācāḥ* *punar* *utthitah*, cf. § 225), 10553 (Arundhatīsahāyah, obtained tranquillity at Ujjānaka).—§ 439 (Yakshayuddhap.): III, 163, 11855 (*sapta devareshayāḥ* . . . ^o*V**o* *pramukhāḥ*).—§ 496 (Skandotpatti): III, 224, 14282 (^o*pramukhā* *muñhyā* *viprendrāḥ*).—§ 527 (Rāmopākhyānap.): III, 277, 15981 (^o*Vāmadevābhāvā*).—§ 543 (Rāmābhishhekā): III, 292, 16597 (^o*Vāmadeva* *ca*, anointed Rāma Dāçarathi).—§ 562 (Bhagavadyānap.): V, 83_η, 2946 (^o*Vāmadeva* *ca*, worshipped Kṛṣṇa).—§ 565 (Gālavacarita): V, 106, 3721 (*rshih*, Dhurma assumed the form of *V.*); 108, 3773 (*atra*—i.e. in the east—*pūrvam* ^o*sya* *paurāṇasya*, *dvijarashba*, *satiq* *caiva* *pratishṭha* *ca* *nidhanāṇi* *ca* *prakāṣṭate*); 117, 3970 (*remo* . . . *yathā* . . . ^o*V**o* *cākshamālāyā*).—§ 574 (Jambūkh.): VI, 2, 65 (Arundhatī *tayā* *py esha* ^o*V**o* *prshṭhataḥ* *krtah*, one of the stars [in Ursa major]).—§ 589 (Dronābhishhekāp.): VII, 6, 160 (^o*a* *ira* *viprāṇāṇi*, sc. *greṣṭhāḥ*).—§ 599 (Jayadrathavadhap.): VII, 94_ε, 3453 (mentioned in a blessing).—§ 602 (Dronavadhap.): VII, 190_ν, 8727.—§ 615_ε (Suptasārasvata): IX, 38, 2212 (performed a sacrifice for Kuru in Kurukshetra).—§ 615_η (Viçvāmitra): IX, 40, 2302 (^o*āgramāṇi*), 2303 (*Brahmaṇāḥ sutah*), 2304 (*munisattamāṇi*) (*V.*'s hostility with Viçvāmitra, cf. § 223).—§ 615_η (*Vasishthāpavāhā*): IX, 42, 2358 (^o*syāpavāhāḥ*), 2360, 2361 (^o*āgramo* *vai* ^o*sya*, in Sthāṇutīrtha), 2365, 2366 (*Viçvāmitra*-^o*V**au*), 2367, 2369 (*dvijaçreshṭhāṇi*), 2374, 2376, 2377, 2378, 2380, (2381), 2383, 2392, 2393 (*rshisattamāṇi*) (Viçvāmitra ordered the Sarasvatī to bring *V.* to him that he might slay him).—§ 615_η (Badarāpācana): IX, 48, 2767 (*viprarsheḥ*), 2768 (Indra assumed the form of *V.*).—§ 635 (Rājadhd.): XII, 37, 1354 (preceptor of Bhīshma).—§ 637 (do.): XII, 48, 1568 (^o*çishyāṇi*, i.e. Bhīshma); 47_η, 1594 (among the ḥshis who surrounded Bhīshma).—§ 641_η (Mucukundop.): XII, 74, 2814 (the purohita of Mucukunda); 122, 4499 (*īçāṇi* *viprāṇāṇi*).—§ 656 (Khadgotpattik.): XII, 168_α, 6135 (^o*āṅgirāsau*, among the mind-born sons of Brahmā), (β), 6142 (^o*Gautamāgastyādh*).—§ 665 (Mokshadh.): XII, 208_α, 7570 (the seventh of Brahmā's seven sons), (ι), 7598 (the second of the ḥshis of the north).—§ 677 (do.): XII, 235, 8591 (Runtideva gave lukewarm water to *V.*), 8601 (*avarshati* *Parjanya*-*sarvabhbūtāni* *bhūtakṛt* ^o*V**o* *jīrayām* *āśa* *Prajāpatir* *iva* *prajāḥ*), 8604 (Mitrasaha, i.e. Kalmāshapāda, gave his wife Madayantī to *V.* (C. *Dumayantīm*), cf. § 225).—§ 693_η (Vṛtravadha): XII, 282, 10118 (restored Indra to senses by uttering the Rathantara sāman), (10119), 10124, 10130.—§ 702 (Mokshadh.): XII, 293_α, 10762; 297, 10877 (pronagator of one of the four original gotras).—
