(5) Arjuna, marching out on his excellent chariot in the company of Kṛṣṇa and Sātyaki looked like moon, accompanied by Budha and Sukra, destroying the darkness 7.60.20. [For Budha also see Section 1.7]

Brhaspati m.: Name of a planet (Jupiter), also called Guru (12. 139. 15).

A. Description: Very bright (praivalita) 6. 3. 25. B. Importance: Brhaspati, along with other planets, visits the sabhā of Brahmadeva 2, 11, 20; Brhaspati, with other planets, finds place in the Daivatavamsa 13, 151, 12, C. Name of Surva: Brhaspati appears as the 22nd name among the 108 names of Surya taught oy Dhaumya to Yudhisthira 3, 3, 19. D. Bad omen: (1) Among the bad omens pointed out by Vyasa to Dhrtarastra one was related to Brhaspati making retrograde movement in the constellation Śravana (maghāsv angārako vakrah *ravane ca brhaspatsh) 6.3.13: (2) The other omen observed by Vyasa was that the Brhaspati and Sanaiscara were stationed near the two stars Visakha and were in that position for a year (samvatsarasthāvinau ca grahau prajvalstāv ubhau l višākhayoh samīpasthau brhaspatišanaišcarau) 6. 3. 25 (Nī. on Bom. Ed. 6. 3. 27: pūrvam śravanastho brhaspatir (reference to 6.3.13) bhaganaksatrasthah sūryaputra (reference to 6. 3. 14) ity uktam / tav ubhau viśākhāsamīpe tiryagvedhena satapade cakre višākhānaksatram vidhyata itu arthah); (3) At the time of the death of Karna, Brhaspati afflicted Rohinī constellation and looked like moon and sun (brhaspati rohinim samprapidya babhūva candrārkasamānavarnah) 8. 68. 49. E. Events connected with Brhaspati: (1) Formerly, when the Treta was about to end and the

Dvāpara was about to commence, as the Guru (Bṛhaspati) was not favourable it did not rain for twelve years (na vavarṣa saha-srākṣaḥ pratilomo 'bhavad guruḥ) 12. 139. 15, 13-14; (2) Mārkaṇḍeya told the Pāṇḍa-vas that when the moon, the sun, the Tiṣya (Puṣya) and Bṛhaspati will come together in the same sign of the zodiac (rāśi), the Kṛtayuga will commence (yadā candraś ca sūryaś ca tathā tiṣyabṛhaspatī / ekarāśau sameṣyanti prapatṣyati tadā kṛtam) 3. 188. 87 (Nī., however, on Bom. Ed. 3. 190. 90; gurusūryacandrāḥ yadā yugapat puṣyanakṣatram eṣyanti tadā kṛtayugapravṛttir ity arthaḥ). [For Bṛūaspati see Section 1.7]

Brahmakalpa m.: A cosmic period of Brahman.

In a former Brahmakalpa, when the brahmarşis met, they entertained doubt about the creation of the world (brahmakalps purā brahman brahmarṣiṇām samāgame | lokasambhavasandehaḥ samutpanno mahātmanām) 12. 176. 6.

Brahmaraśi m.: Name of a constellation (identical with Śravana?).

One of the bad omens pointed out by Vyāsa to Dhrtarāstra was related to the planet Mars who made repeated retrograde movements and then returned to Brahmarasi to remain steady in the constellation Sravana (vakrānuvakram krtvā ca śravane pāvakaprabhah / brahmarāsim samāvrtya lohitāngo vyavasthitah // 6.3.17) (Nī. on Bom Ed. 6. 3. 18: tatrawa sarvatobhadracakre maghāstho lohitāngo 'ngārako vakrānuvakram krtvā punahpunar vakribhūya brahmanā brhaspatinākrāntam rasim naksatram śravanam samāvrtya samyak pūrnadrstyā viddhvā tisthati).
