calas could be ruled as if they were servants (presyavat pāndupāncālān upabhoksyāmahe tatah) — Pañcālas who were like the leaves of a tree in the form of the Pandavas (pancalah patrasaminitah) 7. 157. 19-22: Dhṛtarāṣṭra was curious to know how the Srnjayas and Pancalas who, armed and in battle-arrays (vyūdhānikāh praharinah) fought with Drona when they attacked bim (7. 158. 13); when, Yudhisthira after the death of Ghatotkaca started to fight with Kauravas, Fañcalas armed for battle (damsitah) beat bheris and blew conches 7. 158. 50; Drona vowed that he would take off his armour only after he had killed Pañcalas 7. 160. 12; towards the end of the night war, Drona divided his army into two parts and, led by Duryodhana, attacked Pañcalas: they were specifically afficted by the arrows of Drona; yet, although suffering from excessive pain, Pancalas continued to fight (pāñcālās tu višeseņa droņasāyakapiditāh | samasajjanta rājendra samare bhrsavedanāh) 7. 161. 3, 28; when Drona killed Virāta, Drupada, and other warriors of Pancalas, Dhrstadyumna cursed the Pancala warriors who would let Drona remain alive or turn away from him; Pañcalas then attacked Drona, but they could not even look at Drona although they tried, protected as he was by Duryodhana and others (yatamānāpi pāncālā na šekuh parivi ksitum) 7. 161. 35-37, 38, 40; (53) On the fifteenth day, when the large armies of Kauravas and Pancalas clashed with one another, everything was in turmoil and nothing was quite clear (āvignam abhavat sarvam ... na prājāāyata kimcana); in the raised dust

it was difficult to know who were Kauraveyas and who Pāñcālas 7. 162. 22, 27-28: during the duel between Karna and Bhima. Yudhisthira addressed the chief heroes of Pāñcālas and urged them to go and help the chief warriors of Pandavas (pancalanam naravyāghrān ... tatra gacchata yatraite yudhyante māmakā rathāh); Pāñcālas, thus urged, divided their army into four parts (caturdha vahinim krtva): a part hit Droga with arrows; others, led by Bhima. covered him from another side (pañcalās tv ekato dronam abhyaghnan bahubhih šaraiḥ | bhī masenapurogāś ca ekataḥ paryavārayan //); Arjuna was urged to separate Kurus from Drona; then Pañcalas would kill Drona whose protectors were slain; but Drona attacked Pancalas and killed them; however, they continued to attack Drona; as they were getting killed a fearful sound was raised by them; when Pañcalas were thus getting killed, Pandavas were afraid and they lost hope of victory (vadhyamāneşu samgrāme pāncāleşu ... pāndavān bhayam āviśat /... nā samsur vijayam tadā //) 7. 164. 48-54, 56-58, 60-63; after the false news of Aśvatthāman's death twenty thousand Pancala principal heroes (nararṣabhāḥ ) showered arrows from all sides on Drona; he then used brahmāstra to kill Pañoalas; with that missile he cut off their heads and large arms adorned with gold ornaments (tathaiva parighākārān bāhūn kanakabhūsanān) and killed twenty thousand Pancala chariot-fighters (vimsati. sāhasrān pāncālānām rathavrajān) 7. 164. 78-83; that day Kauravas, led by Drona, had started fighting only with Pancalas ( pañcalair eva kevalaih ), and when Drona released the brahmāstra, especially Pancalas
