## Coded Abbreviations

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To cover a wide range of references we have introduced an alphabetical plan for abbreviations. We have divided it into the following six Series:

- (I) From A to Z
- (II) A to Z with combination of x.
- (III) A to Z with combination of y.
- (IV) A to Z with combination of z.
- (V) A to Z with combination of g.
- (VI) A to Z with combination of J. (for Journals)

During the process of the work, however, we could not avoid repetition and so as to avoid confusion, we have made use of numbers 1 and 2 after the brackets. These inconsistencies are:

- 1.  $(\mathbf{D}\mathbf{x})^1$  and  $(\mathbf{D}\mathbf{x})^2$  after  $\mathbf{D}\mathbf{x}$ .
- 2.  $(Ox)^1$  after Ox.
- 3.  $(Zx)^1$  after Zx.
- 4.  $(\mathbf{Z}\mathbf{y})^1$  after  $\mathbf{Z}\mathbf{y}$ .
- 5.  $(Kz)^1$  and  $(Kz)^2$  after Kz.
- 6. (Mg)1 after Mg.
- 7.  $(CJ)^1$  after CJ.
- 8. (XJ)1 after XJ.
