Āṅgiras (1)—a mānasa son of Brahmā, born of his mouth.¹ Married Śradhdhā, (Pitri-Vi. P.) a daughter of Kardama.² Father of four daughters. His two sons were Utathya and Bṛhaspati.³ Had not yet realised the Supreme Being.⁴ With his pupils visited Bhīṣma lying on his bed of arrows.⁵ Came to see Parikṣit practising *prāyopaveśa*.⁶ Married two of the daughters of Dakṣa. These were Svadhā and Satī. His sons were Pitṛ and Atharvāṅgiras. A Prajāpati.⁷ Once
