

Kṛtavarman (IV)—a son of Kanaka.

Kṛtavīrya (I)—a son of Dhanaka (Kanaka-Br. P., M.P. and Vā. P.) of Arjuna (Kārtavīrya):¹ A king of the Haihaya clan born in the *Kṛtayuga* of Vaivasvata epoch, Varāha kalpa. His hundred sons died on account of a curse by Cyavana. He prayed to Sun god who taught him a *vratam*, by observing which he got a long lived child.²

Kṛtavīrya (II)—a Deva-gandharva.

Kṛtāsauca—the sacred spot where Nṛsimha blessed the Mother Goddess: Here Rudra established his Raudri body in the midst of 'seven mothers'. Here is Ardhanārīśvara praying to Nṛsimha,¹ a *tīrtham* sacred to *Sunhikā*.²

Kṛtasthali(a)—the Apsaras who presides over the month of *Madhu*,¹ coupled with *Ghṛtācī*.²
