

Kauśika (VII)—a son of Vasudeva and Saivyā (Vaiśāli-Vi. P.) adopted by his brother Vṛka,¹ born of a Vaiśya wife.²

Kauśika (VIII)—a sage by tapas of the epoch of Sāvarni,¹ a sage of Kurukṣetra who had seven sons who, during famine, had their guru's cow killed and after offering it for śrāddha, made a meal themselves; but after five rebirths they attained final beatitude. These five rebirths detailed.²

Kauśika gotras—got different pravaras from the Visvāmitras;¹ about 25 among them mentioned: Pārthivas, Deva-rathas, Yājñavalkyas, Samarśaṇas, Udumbaras, Udumlānas, Tāraḥkas, Yamamuñcatas, Lohiṇyas, Reṇavas, Kāñśavas, Babhravas, Pāṇinas, Dhyānajapyas, Śālāvakyas, Hiraṇyākṣas, Syaṅkratas, Gālavas, Devalas, Yāmadūtas, Sālaṅkāyanabāśakalas, Dadātibādaras, etc.; marriage alliances only with other ṛṣi gotras allowed.²
