

Vidūratha (v)—a son of the IV R̄tu (*Vā. P.*) Sāvarṇī Manu.

Videha (I)—(c) kingdom to which the Yadus migrated. Its king was stationed by Jarāsandha on the western gate during the siege of Gomanta. The capital went by the same name, and here lived a prostitute Pingalā (s.v.) by name.¹ An eastern country;² Parigha and Hari viceroys over.³
